## What we intend to cover in our learning:

### HISTORY

Who were the Vikings? Where did they come from and when did they settle in Britain? How did the Vikings fight? What weapons did they use and how did they fight at sea? Viking traders and explorers. Who were the famous Viking explorers and how far did they travel? What was life like in Viking Britain? What jobs did they do? What did they eat? What were their houses, clothes and jewellery like? What was the Danelaw? Why was it called the Danelaw and where was it? What happened to the Vikings? The Vikings lived in Britain for many years. What happened to them in the end? Were the Vikings all bad? Bloodthirsty pirates or peaceful farmers, craftsmen and traders?
