Fireflies Class



Curriculum Information

Spring Term 2024

Inside this booklet you will find details about your child's learning this half term including key vocabulary that they will come across.

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As readers in Fireflies many children in the class will continue on their RWI phonics journey. Those who have completed the phonics programme will complete Reading Rangers, where we can develop comprehension skills. We come together as a whole

class on a Monday and Wednesday to conduct spelling skills, and a spelling, grammar and punctuation lesson. All children will now receive weekly spelling lists to practice at home.

Key vocabulary: vocabulary, inference, prediction, evidence, summarise



As Writers last term the children worked hard on their 'fixing full stops' programme, where they studied the book The Spider and The Fly. This term, we will be taking those skills and applying them to our new text The First Drawing by Mordicai Gerstein. A wonderful book with beautiful illustrations that links to our History topic The Stone Age.

Key vocabulary: adverbs, fronted adverbials, adjectives, nouns, verbs, simile, metaphor, persuasion

As Mathematician Fireflies will moving onto multiplication and division. This is a crucial unit, particularly for the year 4's who will be learning their times tables to 12. We will be continuing to solidify our understanding of number, and learn how to count in 2's 5's 10' 3's and 4's if your child is in the other years.

Key vocabulary: multiplication grid, times table, multiply, multiplication, division, divide, share, group.



As Designers we are exploring Stone Age art, this will be supported throughout book in English where they explore the idea of the 'First Drawing.' Children will explore materials used to draw within the stone age, evaluate and find meaning in some of the real stone age drawings found before having a go at creating their own.

Key vocabulary: grass weaving, charcoal painting, natural dyes, stencil cave art.

As Scientists we are exploring materials this term, and we have linked it in nicely with our History unit and the children will end the unit by finding the best materials to make a stone age outfit and spear! The children will do lots of testing of natural and man made materials for different purposes e.g. insulation, sound proofing, and structures. We will explore the materials used within the local area and evaluate why those have been used over others.

Key vocabulary: property, hard, soft, squashy, sooth, rough, absorbent, bumpy, opaque, transparent,

translucent, brittle, dull, rigid, flexible, waterproof, elastic, shiny, electrical /thermal conductor/insulator

As Geographers in children will be exploring rivers and mountains. In this fascinating topic, the children will learn what mountains, rivers and coasts actually are, some of the forces that help create and shape these important features, and the effects they have on the world around them. They will learn about the climates, human interactions, and lifestyles shaped by the mountains, rivers and coasts of the world.

Key vocabulary: spring, well, source, tributaries, meander, mouth, banks, erosion, transportation, stream, settlement, peak, range, mountain.







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As Historians, this term the children will be learning about the longest and oldest period of history, the Stone Age. The children will explore all three of the periods within the Stone Age and evaluate which one they would like to experience and why. The children will identify how people lived and what tools they created in order to survive. Fireflies will have an immersive learning experience this term, with links to the Stone Age in their

History, English, Art and Science.

Key vocabulary: cave painting, mammoth, Neolithic Man, fur pelt, spears, hammerstone, Palaeolithic, Mesolithic.



As technicians' Fireflies will be conducting some digital photography. Learners will learn to recognise that different devices can be used to capture photographs and will gain experience capturing, editing, and improving photos. Finally, they will use this knowledge to recognise that images they see may not be real.

Key vocabulary: device, camera, photograph, capture, image, digital, landscape, portrait, framing, subject, compose, light sources, flash, focus, background, editing, filter, format, framing, lighting.

As Theologians our big question in RE this term is 'What is the Holy Trinity?' The children will explore this big question through different ways, they will look at art work, and explore how they represent God. The children will be able to explain how Christianity is Monotheistic, and be able to identify each element of the Trinity. **Key vocabulary:** baptism, Father, Son, Holy Spirit, gospel, incarnation, salvation, trinity, monotheistic, God, symbol.





As Designers this term we will be creating finger puppets. The children will have to create a design, prototype and assess the materials they need in order to create it. Looking at purpose and audience, the children will have a go at creating a storyboard for their puppet and perform this when they have created them. Key vocabulary: fabric, prototype, evaluate, test.
