(Implementation) Key knowledge we will learn:

- Some of the key myths and legends of Anglo Saxon times that link to the many gods they believed in such as Thunor, Frigg and Wade.
- Why the Saxons chose to invade England, what a settlement is and how they travelled to conquer parts of Europe.
- The importance of East Anglia in Saxon England and Sutton Hoo.
- The importance of Offas Dyke in protecting England from Wales.
- The story of Beowulf.

(Implementation) Things to do and find out at home:

English

- Create a Saxon wanted Poster
- Make a Saxon battle plan
- Write a fact File about a Saxon God/King
- Create an information leaflet about the Saxons.
- Using Saxon ruins, create a secret message

Geography

- Investigate which sea they crossed to invade England
- What Natural materials did they bring to England?
- Find out about the population in England before the Saxons invaded.
- What Food did the Saxons grow and was the land ideal for their crops?
