Autumn Term 2025: Heroes Through Time

Welcome to a new, exciting term, and a special welcome to our new children and families.

This half term, our theme is "Heroes Through Time"—exploring both real-life and fictional superheroes. We'll be learning through stories, creativity, and discovery, helping children grow as confident learners and kind friends.

What We're Learning

Your child will explore the world as:

- Readers spotting sounds and words in books and everyday life
- Writers Exploring with mark making, and writing simple words
- **Book Babblers** sharing favourite stories and characters
- Historians looking at family photos and talking about change
- Scientists observing seasonal changes and weather
- Geographers drawing maps of their journey to school
- Artists creating firework and bonfire art
- Mathematicians counting food and solving simple problems

Home Learning Expectations

We encourage:

- Reading or sharing a story at least 4 times a week
- Exploring maths in the world around us, e.g. counting, measuring, using mathematical knowledge at home
- Half-termly topic tasks linked to classroom learning (see below)

Find letter sounds and words in books or signs.

→ Where did you spot them?

💪 I Can Be a Writer

Label body parts using sticky notes. Start by drawing yourself and then creating the labels.

→ Can you stick them in the right places?

Look at family photos from different ages.

Design your own superhero costume.

→ What's the weather like? What clothes do you need?

🕅 I Can Be a Geographer

Draw a map of your route to school.

→ Do you walk or drive? What do you see?

I Can Be an Artist

Create a bonfire or firework picture.

→ What materials can you use?

+ I Can Be a Mathematician

Count your toys or items at home, e.g. buttons, teddies, socks. Go on a nature walk, collect items.

→ How many do you have altogether?
