

Reading C halle nge

As you know reading is hugely important to development across all areas of learning. Children who practice reading for a few minutes each day improve their attention and concentration, working memory and vocabulary along with obvious gains in literacy, comprehension and writing.

For children who cannot read, a shared bedtime story is a great way to enjoy some quality time and will expose children to the language of stories.

For those starting to read, listening to your child reading their reading book gives them an opportunity to practice and show off their skills to their favourite audience!

For children who are already confident readers, listening to them read or sharing a book together allows them time to ask questions about words they don't understand, to chat through new ideas and to practice drawing our some of the feelings and meanings hidden in the texts.

To encourage the children to read this year we are setting a reading challenge. We will be giving out awards for every 30 books read or sessions of reading with an adult for beginners.

There will be a star prize at the end of each term for the child who has gone above and beyond in their reading that term!
